


Kristy Gillespie lives in Warrenton with her husband and daughter. She is a school librarian, blogger, short story writer, and author of the Nirvana series of young-adult dystopian thrillers. She will sign *Jaded* and *Hunted*, Books One and Two of the series, as well as her short-story collection entitled *Even in Death*.

Jennifer Handford lives in Warrenton with her husband and three daughters. Her first novel, *Daughters for a Time*, about infertility, cancer and adoption, won an Amazon Breakthrough Novel Award. She will also sign her other novels: *The Light of Hidden Flowers*, a deeply felt story about self-acceptance and pushing boundaries, and *Acts of Contrition*, about faith, loyalty, and forgiveness in the face of moral ambiguity, guilt, and shattered trust.

Jo James grew up in Kansas and attended Southern Methodist University, where she met and married her husband. After thirty-five years in the Air Force, they now live in Virginia. Her series of novels chronicle the lives an Air Force couple over time: *Be Still My Heart* is an engaging story of young love and marriage; *Thrill My Heart* is a humorous tale of life on England; and *Dear Heart* finds them living in a medieval village in the Netherlands.

Charles Neimeyer is the Director of Marine Corps History at the Marine Corps University, Quantico; his former roles include Dean of Academics at the Naval War College; Vice President of Academic Affairs at Valley Forge Military Academy and College; and history professor at the U.S. Naval Academy. He has published numerous works of military history, including *America Goes to War: A Social History of the Continental Army, 1775–1783* and *The Revolutionary War*. His latest book, *War in the Chesapeake, the British Campaigns to Control the Bay*, details the activity around Washington, Baltimore and Norfolk during the War of 1812, up to the final British defeat in 1814.

Holly Williams has been a leader in a Fortune 50 technology firm, director of business training at Lord Fairfax Community College, faculty member at Georgetown University's Institute for Transformational Leadership, and founder of a consulting firm that specializes in executive coaching. *Being Coached: Group and Team Coaching from the Inside Out* is an engaging series of vignettes told from the viewpoints of leaders in a group coaching program at a fictional company, and shows how creating a true learning community promotes personal and professional growth.
